Mr. and Mrs. Henry Brown and children spent Easter Sunday with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Hoffman, at Brisneton.

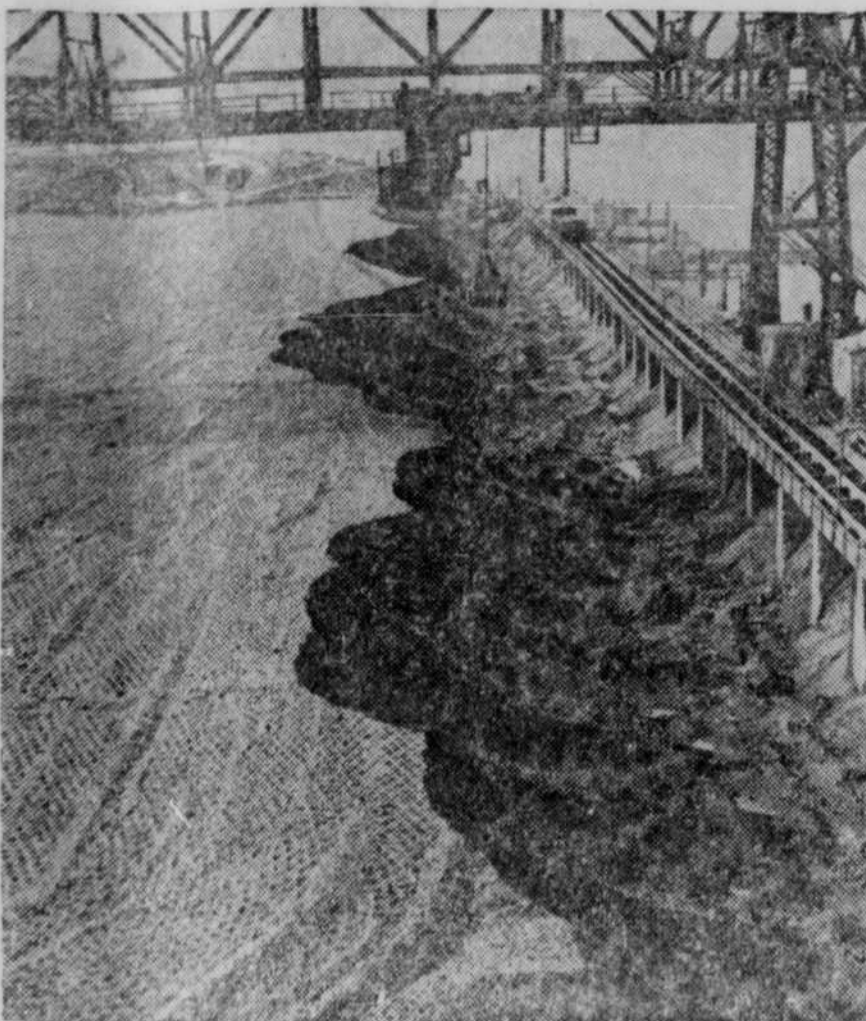

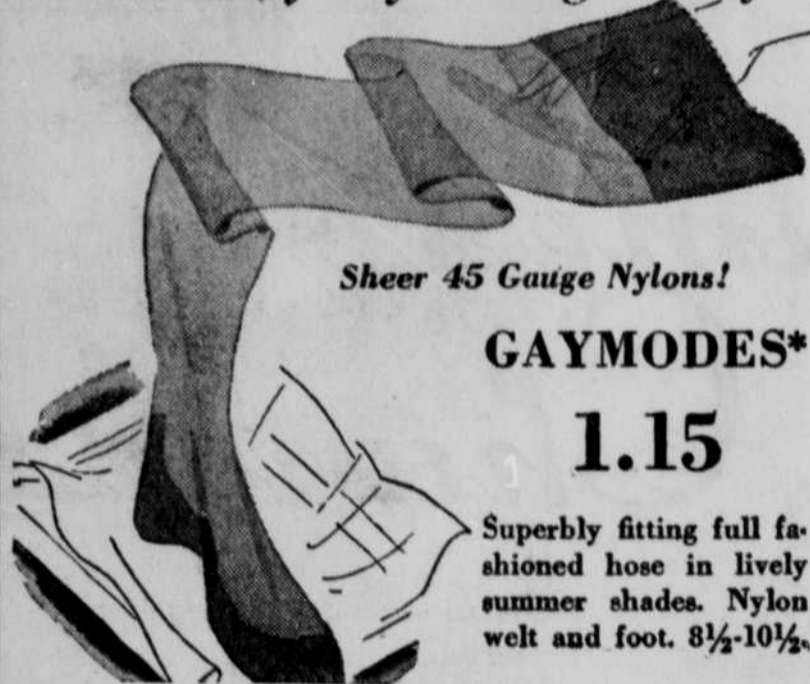
