PROCEEDINGS OF THE HOLT COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Resolution

Whereas it is considered by the County Board of Holt County, Nebraska, that the rural mail route and the star mail route roads of Holt County need improving by the application of gravel or other suitable surfacing, and

Whereas Legislative Bill 195 of the 1947 Legislature of Nebraska provided that the County Board may submit the question to the people of the County to be voted on at a Special General election called by said Board, as to whether said County Board shall vote a special annual tax of one mill on the dollar valuation of all tangible property in said county to be used for such purpose until all of the rural mail route and star mail route roads of the County have been improved by application of gravel or other suitable surfacing,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Hereby Resolved by the County Board of Holt County, Nebraska, that a Special Election of the qualified electors of Holt County, Nebraska, be, and it is hereby called to be held in the several precincts, cities, towns, villages, wards and polling places in said County, on the 13th day of April, 1948, and which election shall be conducted and carried on and notice of which shall be given by the County Clerk of Holt County, in the manner as provided by law relating to Special and general elections for county purposes and at such Special Election there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of Holt County, Nebraska, the question of the voting by the Board of Supervisors of Holt County, of a special annual tax for that purpose of one mill on the dollar valuation of all tangible property in said County of Holt until all of the rural mail route and star route roads of Holt County have been improved by application of gravel or other suitable surfacing.

Be it further resolved, that the County Clerk of Holt County shall forthwith publish for four weeks in a legal newspaper of general circulation in Holt County, Nebraska, a notice of such Special election which shall be substantially in words and content as follows, viz:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

TO THE ELECTORS OF HOLT COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

You are hereby notified that a special election has been called in the manner provided by law, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Holt, Nebraska, to be held on Tuesday, April 13, 1948, between the hours of 8 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. at the usual voting places in said County of Holt, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the County of Holt:

Shall the Board of Supervisors of the County of Holt, Nebraska, commencing with the levy for 1948, vote a special annual tax of one mill on the dollar valuation of all tangible property in Holt County for the purpose of improving all of the rural mail route and star mail route roads of the County of Holt have been improved by application of gravel or other suitable surfacing.

The form in which said proposition shall be submitted shall be by ballot whereon shall be printed the above proposition and immediately below the same, the following

[] For the levy of a special annual tax of one mill on the dollar valuation of all tangible property to pay for improvement of rural mail and

star mail route roads of Holt County.

[] Against the levy of a special annual tax of one mill on the dollar valuation of all tangible property to pay for improvement of rural mail and star mail route roads of Holt County.

Motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hubbard that the above Resolution be adopted. 5:00 P.M. On motion the Board adjourned until March 30, 1948 unless called in before by the Clerk.
