LEGAL NOTICE At the general election, November 2, 1948, there will be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval or rejection the following amendment to Section 1, Article VIII of the Constitution of Nebraska, as proposed by the Legislature: "Sec. 1. The necessary revenue of the state and its governmental subdivisions shall be raised by taxation in such manner as the Legislature may direct; but taxes shall be levied by valuation uniformly and proportionately upon all tangible property and franchises, and taxes uniform as to class may be levied by valuation upon all other property. The Legislature may impose taxes on reservations of mineral rights and fissionable material in land and royalties. Taxes, other than property taxes, may be authorized by law. Existing revenue laws shall continue in effect until changed by the Legislature."
