### **BRING PUMP INTO USE ON SEWER**

The city has found a tempo-rary solution to its sewer prob-

A pump is being leased to force sewerage from the lower end of the municipal sewer system into the Elkhorn river. In recent weeks the mouth of the sewer has been partially clogged and sewerage has backed up into the system, overflowing from several manholes and spreading out over a portion of Carney park and other acreages in South O'-

Most of the trouble, city officials say, is attributed to the inadequacy of the system. The installation dates from 1913.

Donald Price, of Lincoln, city engineer, made arrangements for the pump which is being set up on a lease basis. The city will have an option to buy the pump and turn rental payments onto its purchase price. chase price.

Some city officials feel that the measure is strictly temporary and ultimately a disposal system will have to be installed. Law prohibits creation of new sewerage outlets into Nebraska streams.

#### Replacement Cattle Values Edge Higher on Atkinson Market

Under urgent demand and light receipts, choice steers sell from \$29 to \$31.50 a hunredweight at Tuesday's auction; butcher hogs reached \$20.

The largest attendance in over a month plus small receipts and an advancing fat cattle market gave stocker and feeder cattle prices a boost at last Tuesday's auction in At-kinson. Muddy roads held receipts to a few over 300 head —the lightest since last Sum-

Although the entire list sold higher than a week ago, the advance was most pronounced

advance was most pronounced on lightweight stockers and feeding cows which looked another dollar up on top of last week's sharp advance and now places these two classes within striking distance of all time highs of early last Fall.
