WHEREAS, it is the desire and intention of the parties hereto to preserve and maintain for the public generally...

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows: 1. That the said Henry Dobrovolsky, his heirs, successors...

11. That in conjunction with the right to travel across said land, there is hereby a l s o granted by the said Henry Dobrovolsky a right and privilege to the public to travel over and across said bridge traversing Holt Creek in the Southeast Quarter of said section.

11. It is further stipulated and agreed between the parties that the primary responsibility for the care and upkeep of said bridge rest upon the said Henry Dobrovolsky who is the owner thereof; but that if for any reason said bridge is not kept in a reasonable and ordinary condition to permit normal traffic and travel thereon, that in that event the said Township of Francis or any resident therein having occasion to use said road and bridge, shall have the right to do all things reasonable necessary to maintain and keep said bridge and the approaches thereto in a reasonable state of repair to enable travel thereon, which said cost of maintenance or repair if performed by the said Francis Township or other person shall be at their or its own expense without charge upon Henry Dobrovolsky.

IV. It is further specified and agreed between the parties that there is an auto gate now situated on the South end of said road, and that t h e Township of Francis agrees to purchase and furnish another auto gate to be placed approximately in the middle of said road toward the center of the section in the now existing fence running through said Section; that the said Henry Dobrovolsky will install such auto gate in place and maintain the same in working ord-

er, and that thereafter Henry Dobrovolsky will permit the placing and maintenance of auto gates along said road wherever the same may be necessary and at the entrances and exits of said road. V. It is further specified that this agreement shall be construed to create a privilege only of travel over and across said Section 27, and shall not be construed to vest the title to any of said premises in the Township of public generally, and that the title and ownership off said land shall remain at all times in the said Henry Dobrovolsky; that it is further understood that any and all persons having occasion to travel over said road and bridge shall do so in a law abiding manner without committing any acts of vandalism, lawlessness and without unnecessary damage or destruction to the premises or property of Henry Dobrovolsky.
