After the delivery is inaugurated and if the demand warrants, the delivery can be extended to other portions of the city.

"This is a starter and will employ at least one man full time," Bowen explained.

Eighteen members were present at Tuesday's session. Ed Wilson, member of the board of directors, presided in the absence of President Melvin Ruzicka.

A. P. Jaskowski reported on the Holt county athletic banquet to be held here April 19. While Nebraska university's football coach, Bill Glassford, was considering leaving the Cornhuskers to go to Pittsburg university, his alma mater, the O'Neill banquet plans were hinged on his decision. Now that he has decided to remain at Nebraska, banquet plans are going ahead.

Invitations have been sent to 9 Holt county high schools to have athletic lettermen and coaches present for the banquet, which will be held in the American Legion auditorium.

"All schools have indicated a desire to be represented," Jaskowski reported. "Arrangements are being made to serve 150 to 175 persons."

Others on the banquet committee, besides Jaskowski, are J. B. Grady, H. J. Lohaus and John C. Watson.

A Neil Dawes asked the Chamber to again furnish pop for the annual family fun night for 4-H club and extension groups on Saturday, March 11. The Chamber okayed the request.

Dawes also discussed the district Grass Day program to be held Tuesday, February 28, at Stuart.

Secretary James W. Rooney said that O'Neill has been asked to entertain a district meeting of the Nebraska Stock Growers' association and the date of

Wednesday, April 26, has been recommended. The Nebraska Cow Belles, women's auxiliary, will meet simultaneously. Nearly five hundred persons will attend. ## Spencer Man Dies While Wading Snow

SPENCER — Alva Hornback, 49, single Spencer farmer, was found dead Wednesday noon, February 15, in a cornfield about a mile from his house. A coroner's inquest revealed that death was not due to foul play but probably a heart attack.

Mr. Hornback, who lived alone 3 miles south of Spencer, was last seen in Spencer late Saturday night. His parked car was discovered by neighbors early Tuesday and the body was found midway between the car and his house, suggesting that he had attempted to wade the snowdrifts alone.

When he couldn't be found by Tuesday, neighbors became alarmed, and the search was begun.

Survivors include: mother — Mrs. John (Mary Etta) Hornback, who is visiting in Hot Springs, S. D.; brothers — Walter, Lester, Ray and several other near relatives.

Funeral services are tentatively set for Friday at 2 p.m. in Wesleyan Methodist church at Spencer.

Doctors said Mr. Hornback had been dead "about 3 days."
