Dear Mrs. Pease:

I intended to write you right away but it seems pretty easy for me to neglect writing. If I had written you every time I thought of it, I'm sure you would not need to ask for more letters for some time. My, how time flies! Before you know it, spring will be here again.

I'm sending you a couple recipes and some hints that might be of help to someone.

To make homemade bread shine, swab the top with vinegar when almost baked, then return it to oven for a few minutes.

A teaspoon of baking powder, added to a pound of cottage cheese, greatly improves the flavor.

**EASTER EGG CAKE**  
Bake your special white cake in a round pan and cut 3 slices from the center. Push the 2 parts together and hold with frosting so it will be an oval shape resembling an egg. Give the cake generous frosting and decorate it to look like an Easter egg.

If custard curdles drop 2 or 3 marshmallows in it and stir until they are melted. With an egg beater, whip the custard and

in a few minutes it will be smooth.

### SPAGHETTI VEGETABLE SALAD

One cup spaghetti, one-third cup whipping cream, two-thirds cup salad dressing, two cups cooked green beans, one-half cup diced cooked beets, two-thirds cup diced American cheese, three diced sweet pickles, three diced hard cooked eggs, 1 minced small onion. Cook spaghetti in salted water, rinse with cold water and drain.

Blend stiffly whipped cream with salad dressing, mix spaghetti with other ingredients and moisten to taste with dressing. Serve on lettuce.

### SALMON SALAD

One can salmon, red, one cup chopped English walnuts, eight small pickles, three hard cooked eggs, one-fourth cup vinegar. Chop egg whites, mash yolks, and mix with vinegar, season to taste, pick the salmon to pieces and mix with chopped pickles. Pour vinegar and yolks over the mixture.

Dear Blanche:  
Am sending in some recipes I know are good as I have used them myself.

### LIVER CARROT PIE

Two cups diced cooked liver, two onions diced, two cups diced cooked carrots, one-fourth cup lard, two cups cooked macaroni, three cups medium white sauce, dash salt, pepper, and make biscuit dough. Combine ingredients, season to taste, mix thoroughly. Pour into well-greased casserole, cover with biscuit dough, bake in hot oven of 425 F. until dough is brown, about 20 minutes.

### RED CABBAGE SALAD

One tablespoon unflavored gelatin, three tablespoons sugar, three tablespoons vinegar, one-half cup water, one cup hot grape juice, one-half teaspoon salt, one cup chopped celery, one teaspoon lemon juice, one-half cup chopped cabbage, one minced green pepper. Soften gelatin in cold water, dissolve in grape juice, add lemon juice, vinegar, sugar and salt. Chill until slightly firm, add vegetables, pour into cold water - rinsed mold, chill until firm.

I am including some household hints which I thought might help others: Hairpins can be used to fasten the hems of marquisette curtains for machine stitching. Lower left, using hairpins saves much time spent basting and removing threads and does not damage the curtains.

Rust rings caused by setting scouring powder cans on porcelain fixtures in the kitchen or bathroom are prevented by covering the bottom edges of the cans with strips of cellulose tape.

Coffee - cream stains on table cloths will be considerably reduced if a small amount of butter or lard is placed just under the spot of the pitcher. This keeps the drippings from running down the side of the pitcher and soiling the tablecloth.

Soiled stockings caused by rubbing against the tops of galoshes are prevented by placing strips of adhesive tape around inside of galoshes at this point. Tape is replaced when soiled or worn, and to keep from slipping on icy walks or ground, cut strips of adhesive tape and put across the soles of your galoshes. Two strips on soles and heels. You'll never slip on the ice.

Rapid sewing by machine will not cause the spool to spin and unwind the thread too rapidly if a rubber faucet washer is

placed over the spindle and on top of the spool to serve as a friction brake.

A drinking glass is less likely to slip from the hand of a child if several wide rubberbands are placed over the glass to give it a non-slip grip.

### UPSIDE DOWN CHILI PIE

One pound ground beef, one-third cup chopped onion, one-half teaspoon salt, one tablespoon lard, one cup cooked kidney beans, one-fourth teaspoon chili powder, one teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, one cup cooked tomatoes, saute meat and onion in melted lard, add beans, seasoning, and tomatoes, cover and simmer about 15 minutes. Pour into a greased 9-inch pie plate. Top with corn bread batter and bake in a hot oven of 425 F. for 20 minutes.

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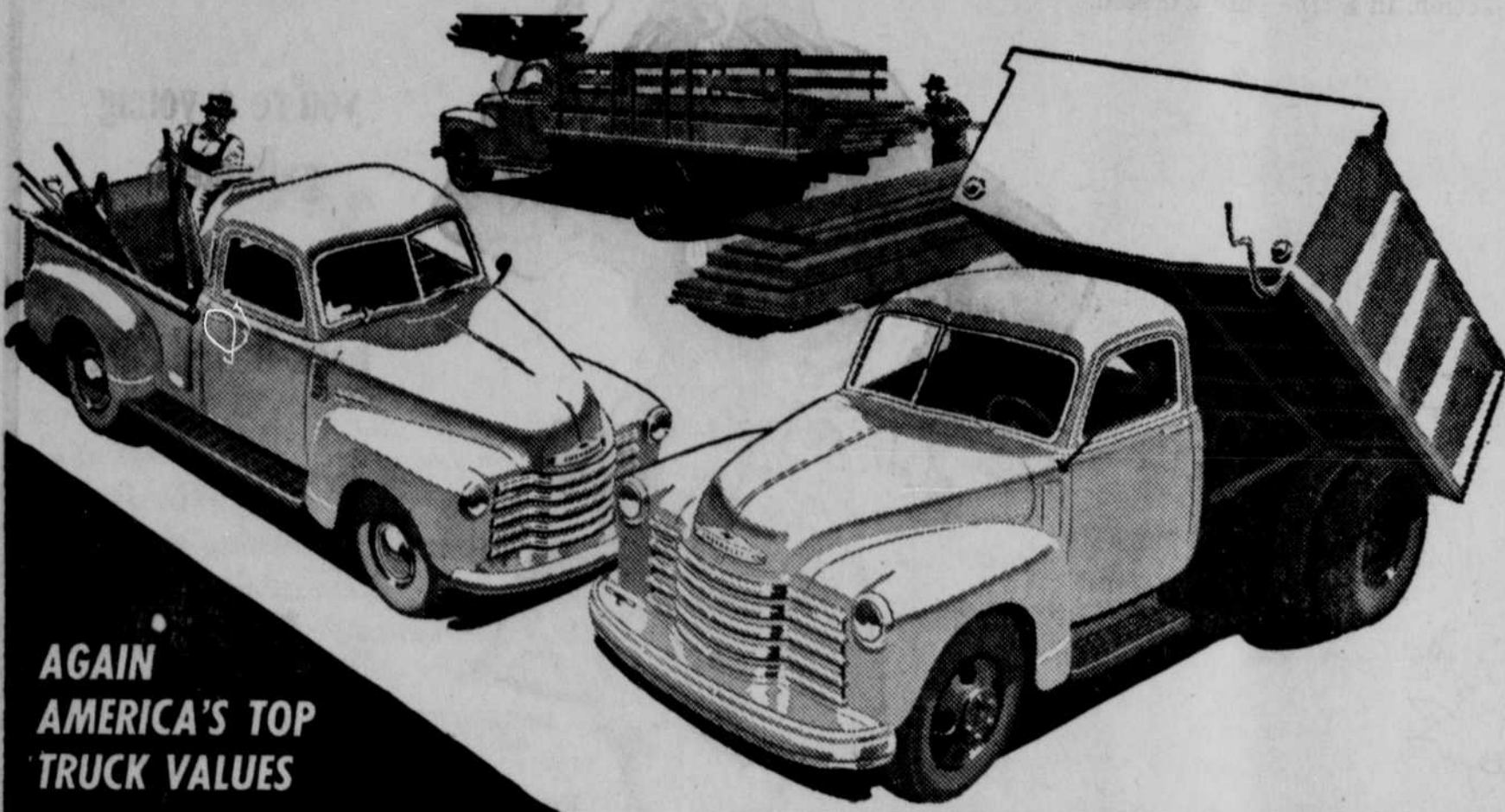
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
