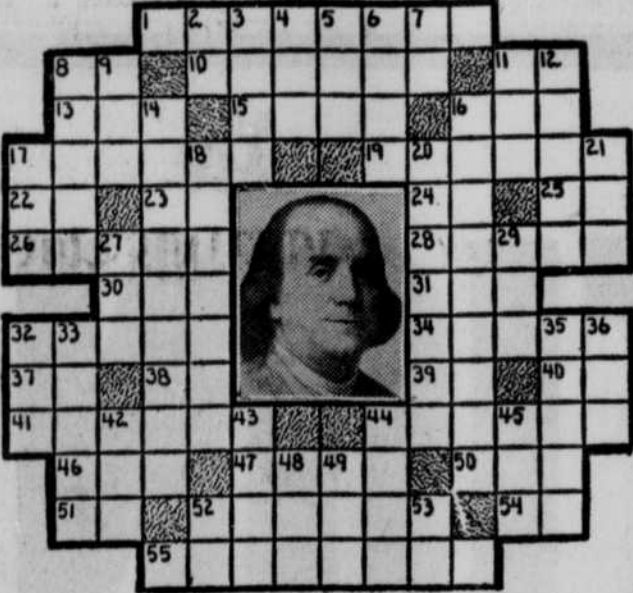
WEEKLY CROSSWORD PUZZLE
