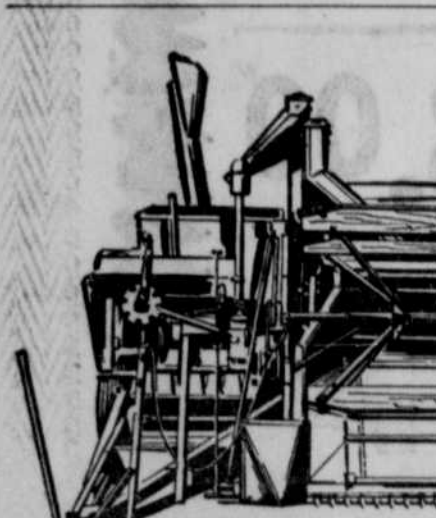

ORDINANCE NO. 250A
An ordinance vacating certain streets and alleys in the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, providing for making a record of such vacation in the office of the City Clerk of O'Neill, Nebraska; providing for a record of such vacation in the office of the County Clerk of the County of Holt and State of Nebraska.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska:

1. That Williams Street running East and West between Block 3 on the North and Block 4 on the South in McCafferty's Annex to the City of O'Neill, from the point on the West where said Williams Street intersects First Street to the point on the East where said Williams Street intersects Second Street, be, and the same hereby is, vacated, annulled and discontinued.

2. That the alley running east and west across Block 4, McCafferty's Annex to the City of O'Neill, which alley is bordered on the North by Lots 1 to 8, inclusive, and on the South by Lots 8, to 16, inclusive, be, and the same hereby is, vacated, annulled and discontinued.
