600 Hogs, 600 Cattle Are Marketed Here

There were about 600 head of hogs at the O'Neill Livestock market Thursday, September 6. Butcher hogs were quoted from \$20.25 to \$20.50; sows, \$18.40 to \$18.70; stags, \$14.50 to \$15.00. There was a pretty fair run of feeder pigs selling up to \$24.50 per hundredweight.

There were about 600 cattle through the O'Neill ring Thursday.

Good kinds of yearling steers brought \$34.00 to \$37.00; yearling heifers, \$28.00 to \$32.00. There was a consignment of 900-pound whiteface steers. These went for \$36.10. Good kind of cows were selling from \$24.50 to \$26.00, on down to \$17.00 on poorer quality cows. Bulls were quoted from \$26.00 to \$27.00.

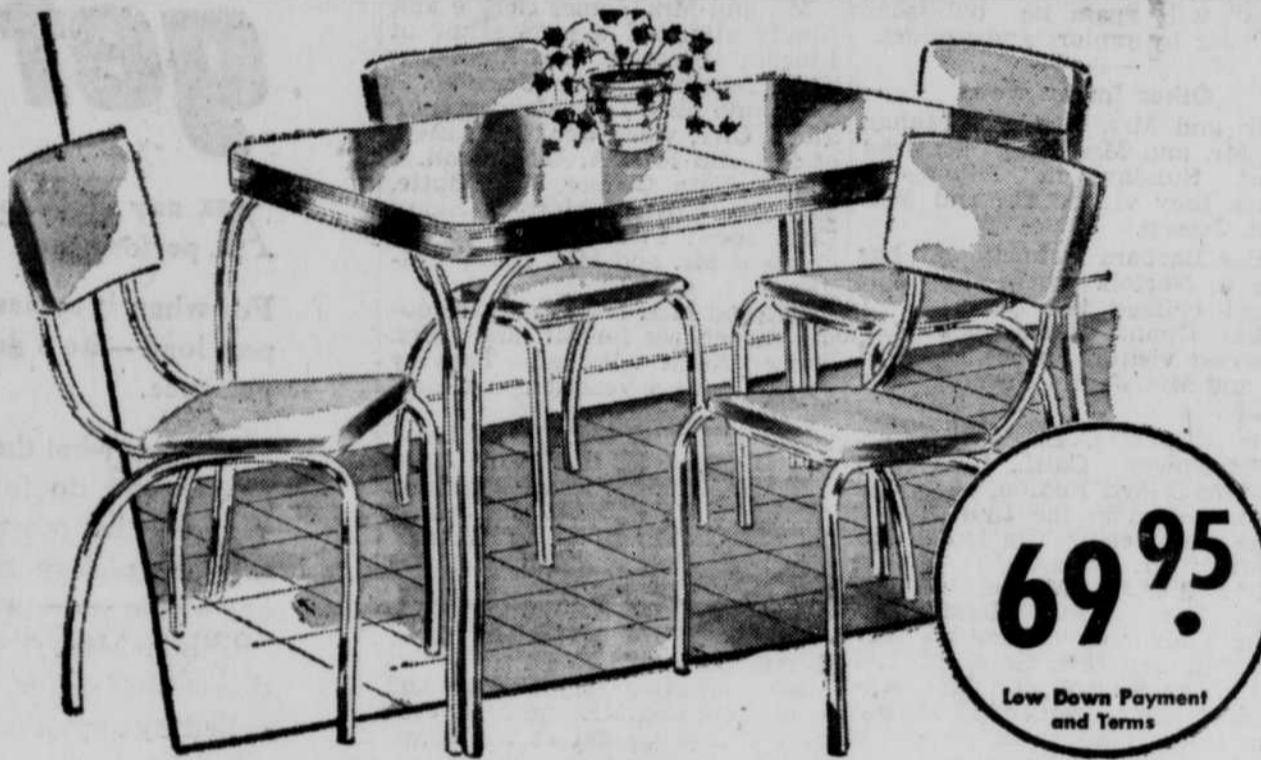

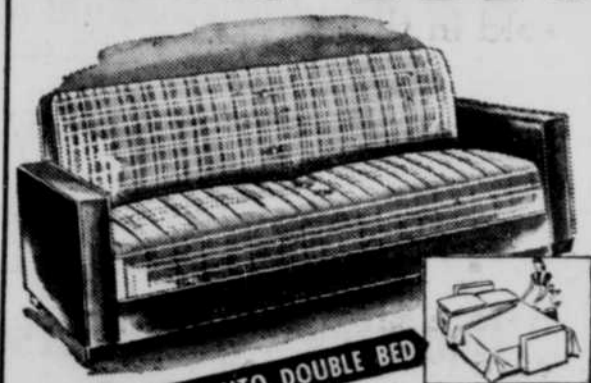

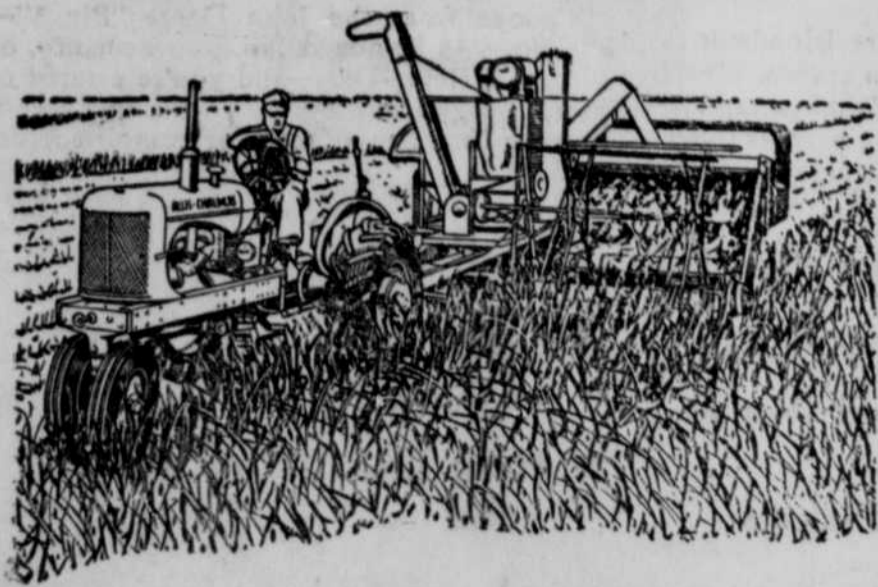
