 Mr. Werner made the trip from Spinnard to Seattle, Wash., in 5 1/2 days and arrived in Atkinson 3 days later. He said that on one stretch of the road he traveled 600 miles from one heated garage along the highway to the next. Usually they are much closer together than that.
