Two eggs, 2 cups milk, 2 cups prepared pancake flour. Beat eggs and combine with milk, add to pancake flour and stir the ingredients until well blended. Bake on a hot griddle. Keep pan-cakes warm in the oven. Spread about 2 tablespoons of meat filling on each pancake and roll. Serve hot with tomato sauce if desired. Serves 6 to 8. MEAT FILLING

One pound ground beef, 1/2 cup chopped onicn, 3 tablespoons shortening, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/8 teaspoon pepper, 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder, 1/4 teaspoon celery seed, 1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 1/2 teaspoon horse radish, two-thirds cup chili sauce or catsup, one-third cup water. Brown ground beef and onion in fat. Add remaiinng ingredients, and simmer 45 minutes.
