

CCC Corn-Selling Thursdays Here

The days for selling of CCC corn in Holt county is as follows: Each Tuesday and Wednesday at Page, and Thursdays only in O'Neill.

"It has become necessary that we sell an amount of corn not to exceed your needs for 3 weeks and one must secure a permit from the Holt county PMA committee before you are eligible to purchase any of this corn," explained Harry E. Ressel, chairman of the PMA committee.

It is planned that a member of the committee will be at the weigh station to issue these permits.

The Holt county PMA office will not henceforth be open on Saturday afternoons.

December 31 is the deadline on compliance reports of performance and all supporting evidence such as seed receipts. These must be on file in the county office by the above mentioned date, Ressel said.
