Motion by Frickel, seconded by Sterns that the following Resolution be adopted:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, There now exists a public road, being a designated County Road, extending one mile east and west on the section line between sections 30 and 31 in Township 31 North, range 11, West of the 6th P. M., in Holt County, Nebraska, which said road was by action of the County Board of Holt County, in the year 1914 declared a public road by reason of adverse user and prescription, and

Whereas it appears that a public road has been used and maintained continuously on said section line for more than forty years last past, and,

Whereas it further appears that the width of said section line road has never been officially established, and whereas there is a possibility that certain portions of said road as previously used do not extend a full distance of thirty-three feet to the north and south of said section line, and whereas it now appears necessary that a section line road between said sections should be officially established and declared for the full width of sixty-six feet, and extending a distance of thirty-three feet to the north and south of the section line between said sections for the full distance of one mile east and west between said sections, and that it is necessary in establishing said road that notice be given to the adjoining land owners in sections 30 and 31 for the purpose of permitting them to present claims for damages for any portions of their said lands which shall be taken in addition to the present road way for the purpose of widening and establishing said road to a full width of sixty-six feet,

NOW, THEREFORE, It is hereby resolved by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Holt that a section line road be, and the same hereby is established for a distance of one mile east and west running between sections 30 and 31 in township 31 North, Range 11, west of the 6th P. M. in Holt County, Nebr., said roadway to be of a total width of sixty-six feet north and south, and extending thirty-three feet north and south from the center line of the said section line between said sections, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this board meet in session on the 20th day of December, 1951 at the hour of 1:30 P. M., for the purpose of hearing and allowing claims for damages by adjacent land owners for the extension of said highway beyond the present boundaries thereof to a maximum distance of thirty-three feet on each side of the section line.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk give notice to the owners of lands bounding upon said highway of the date and place of hearing upon claims for damages, and requiring said land owners to file claims for damages, by mailing a copy of this resolution to each of the same by registered mail at least fifteen days prior to the date of hearing

above set.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Holt County, Nebraska of Holt County, Nebraska, in consideration of \$1.00 receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and the further payment of a sum to make a total payment of \$1.00 for two poles and one anchor when set on the following described property, does hereby grant and convey unto the Consumers Public Power District (hereinafter called "District") its lessees, successors and assigns, the

permanent right, privilege and easement of a right-of-way to construct, operate, maintain and remove all poles, wires, guys and other necessary equipment in connection therewith, on and across the following described property situated in Holt County, Nebraska, more particularly described as follows:

Part of the southwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Sec. 29, T. 29N, R11W, known as non-descript No. 43 of the City of O'Neill, Holt county, Nebraska.

The pole line herein contemplated shall be located on the property approximately as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south line and one foot east of the west line of the above described property, approximately 68 rods east and 2 rods north of the Southwest corner of the NW 1/4 of Section 29, thence in a northerly direction approximately 20 rods to a point on the north line one foot east of the west line of the said property.

The District shall also have the privilege and easement of ingress and egress across the property to its officers and employees for any purpose necessary in connection with the construction, operation, maintenance, inspection and removal of said line.

The District shall also have the right at any time to trim or remove such trees and under brush as may in any way endanger or interfere with the safe operation of the lines and equipment used in connection therewith.

The District shall at all times exercise all due care and diligence to avoid injury or damage to the crops, livestock and other personal property of the Grantor, and the District shall indemnify and save harmless the Grantor from any such damage and loss arising or occurring to such property solely by reason of the construction, operation, maintenance and removal of said transmission lines.

The District Agrees that should the transmission lines constructed hereunder be abandoned for a period of five years, the right-of-way or easement hereby secured shall then cease and terminate, and this contract shall be of no further force and effect.
