Raps Committee— "You have already seen publicity issued by the so-called Citizen's committee, operating for the now defunct Hoover commission announcing strategy and program of securing the passage of the 5 bills adversely affecting the rights and benefits of veterans, including reorganization of the VA and the elimination of many veterans' employment rights under the present laws," a spokesman for Simonson post, of the American Legion, said Wed-

"They do not guarantee or even claim that they will effect any economy in administration let alone improve the service to the disabled veterans and their de-pendents," he said.

"Spokesmen for the Citizen's committee deal only in high sounding generalities. They do not discuss what will occur if their specific bills become law. They talk about billions of dollars to be saved in administra-tive costs. So far as the veterans' benefits are concerned, administrative costs are not more than 5 percent of the total. If billions, or anything like it are to be saved, then the savings will come from the curtailment of veterans' benefits, not from administrative economies."
