famines, pestilences, gold, silver. "These crises start people moving-uprooting them-and stimulate activities and inventions. "And today we are confronted with new, more complex problems. We are confronted with new philosophies and new ideologies. We must reaffirm and refocus old concerns on these new problems. Behind the leadership of our church we will test these

problems with old Gospel truths. "This is a crusade, a pilgrimage. To travel hopefully is bet-
