As usual, the emphasis will be on exhibits of the "cream of the crop" from Nebraska's agriculture and industry, but there will also be plenty of thrilling entertainment to make the fair "a harvest of fun for everyone, in the words of the state fair board.

Henry F. Brandt, sr., of Beatrice, president of the board, and Ed Schultz of Lincoln, secretary, are confident that the 1953 show will set another new record for all-around education and enter-

The two officers point out that many improvements have been made in the grounds and buildings at Lincoln.

A new administration building will be completed this summer, while parking areas have been increased in size and given a rock surfacing. Many of the outdoor display areas also have been rock surfaced.
