

ORANGE ROLLS Two yeast cakes (or two packages quick granulated yeast), 1/4 cup lukewarm water, one egg (well beaten), six tablespoons melted shortening, two teaspoons salt, 1/2 cup sugar, 3/4 cup orange juice, one teaspoon grated orange peel, about four cups sifted flour. Combine the ingredients in the order given and beat until smooth, stirring in enough flour to make a soft dough. Turn onto floured board, knead until smooth and elastic. Place in a greased bowl, brush with melted shortening. Cover, let rise in warm place until double in size. Knead again. Shape into rolls. Let rise until

double in size and bake in 400 F. oven about 20 minutes.






