The Frontier Woman All 6 Kids Dearly Love to Eat By BLANCHE SPANN PEASE. October! Gosh, how did this all happen? Only yesterday we could hardly wait until the sweet corn was ready to eat! Time has been playing some downright dirty tricks on us by slipping away so fast and we can't do a thing about it. On second thought, I guess we did. Those jars of stuff on the shelves, those packages of frozen fruit and vegetable and pickle fruits and vegetables in the freezer, those cartons of dressed poultry and other foods! We can't say we're proud right out loud, can't we? It's time now to dig gladiolius bulbs, that is, the general rule is to dig them six to eight weeks after flowering. When the leaves die down, cut off the withered tops about four inches above the ground, then dig. Bulbs are soft when first dug, so hang them in bunches or spread to dry for two or three weeks. When bulbs are dry, clean off the foliage, pull off dried roots, but don't remove the husks. Store in paper bags with naphthalene flakes or crushed mothballs (one tablespoon to each 25 bulbs) to discourage thrips. Put flakes in bag, cover with sheet of paper, then put in the bulbs. Keep in a cool place, about 40 degrees. Now for good things to eat. This is the time of year when baked things do taste so good. PINEAPPLE SAUCE CAKE. One-half cup shortening, one cup sugar, two eggs (separated), 2/3 cup crushed pineapple (undrained), 1 1/2 cup sifted all purpose flour, 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt. Cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add egg yolks and flavorings and beat well. Stir soda into pineapple and add to mixture. Sift flour with baking soda and stir into mixture, beating until evenly and smoothly blended. Add salt to egg whites and beat stiff, fold into batter. Bake in greased 8x8x2 inch pan in moderate oven of 350 F. about 40 minutes or until done. Cool. Frost with: PINEAPPLE SEVEN-MINUTE FROSTING. In double boiler mix one un-beaten egg white, two tablespoons syrup from pineapple, 1/4 cup sugar, dash of salt. Place over boiling water and beat with rotary beater four to seven minutes, until frosting stands up in peaks when beater is lifted. Remove from heat, add 1/2 teaspoon vanilla, and 1/4 teaspoon lemon extract, and beat two or three minutes longer. Spread roughly on cool cake, and decorate with drained crushed pineapple.

Wheeler Phone Fuss Enters New Phase

BARTLETT—Wheeler county's telephone dispute entered another phase last week. In local newspapers, the Beaver Valley Phone company published a notice of dissolution. Eighty percent of the stockholders signed the notice. It will become effective December 31 this year. The telephone company listed assets of 88 miles of wire, 65 telephones, 1,016 poles and switching equipment. The move was apparently a counter to a decision in district court forcing the telephone company to restore service to Wheeler county courthouse offices, pending a settlement in rates.
