Burwell Voters Okay \$80,000 School Bond
BURWELL—Burwell voters approved an \$80,000 school bond issue here May 11 by a margin of four votes.

Burwell City Attorney William Mansel said the city council would meet to enter negotiations with architects for the completion of the proposal. Two hundred and ninety-three voters went to the polls to ballot on the proposal. One hundred and sixty-six persons voted for the plan and 127 voted against it. The proposal needed 55 percent of the total vote cast to be adopted.
