Cutworm Damage to Corn Reported

Numerous calls have been received at the Holt county agent's office relative to spraying for cutworms.

County Agent A. Neil Dawes states that cutworms may be poisoned or sprayed. However, spraying may not always be as effective as poison baits, but spraying with some of the newer chemicals such as dieldrin, aldrin, toxaphene, clordance and DDT.

Extension circular 1504 gives directions for spraying and baiting. It is available by writing or contacting the county extension service in O'Neill.

Corn that has been replanted should be sprayed. If you use toxaphene apply one gallon of 60 percent to three acres. If using aldrin use one gallon to four acres. Spray directed down the rows may be more effective than a general broadcast spray.
