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

The citation reads: "For exemplary conduct in ground combat against the armed enemy while assigned as private, 263d infantry regiment, on or about 4 February 1945, in the European theater of operations."

The presentation was made last month at Schweinfurt, Germany. News of the award reached the parents here last week in a letter from their son dated July 29.

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
