Seasonal Unemployed Increase Is Noted A seasonal increase in unemployment was recorded at the Norfolk office of the Nebraska state employment service in October when the count of work applications on file increased from 163 on October 1 to 209 on November 1—a 28 percent gain. Only a slight gain was noted for the city of Norfolk. Total unemployment on November 1 was 61 percent worse than on the same date one year ago.
