# Snow Helps Wheat,

Snow in Nebraska's panhandle ast week brought "some benefit" winter wheat, government crop observers said. And although the crop is maintaining its high average condition, there is still reed of moisture before the wheat goes into the dormant stage for winter, according to the state-federal division of agricultural statistics.

Most of the 2 to 4 inches of snow which fell over the panhandle November 30 and December 1 remained on the fields. Valentine received the most snownine inches.

A little western Nebraska wheat hasn't enough growth for protection against wind, but most of the crop has an unusually good top growth as well as root develcpment. The moisture need is greatest in southwestern and central Nebraska.

Other crop report observations: erable plowing and liming of soil

The highest yield of milo reported to the office so far was 114 bushels per acre, from south-central Nebraska field. One central Nebraska report says farmers with irrigation wells have been watering alfalfa and wheat fields.

Pasture conditions showed little change last week, although snow removed the dust and softened range feed.

Autumn weather has been favorable for feeding livestock and for fall farrowing. October cattle slaughted totaled 152,000 head compared with 161,000 in October last year.

November was warm and dry, with temperatures averaging about two degrees above normal in the southwest, to more than eight degrees above in the north-


