HOT MEAT DISH

One pound ground beef, one pound ground pork, one green pep-per (ground), one cup diced celery, two small onions, two teaspoons salt, one pound elbow macaroni (cooked), two No. 2 cans cream style corn, two cans chicken-rice soup (not diluted), alt and pepper.

Brown beef and pork in drippings and season with salt and pepper. Add onions. Mix all ingredients together. Put into buttered baking dish and cover with buttered bread crumbs. Bake one hour at 350 F. to 375 F. Serves 20, so is fine when you are servng a large group.




