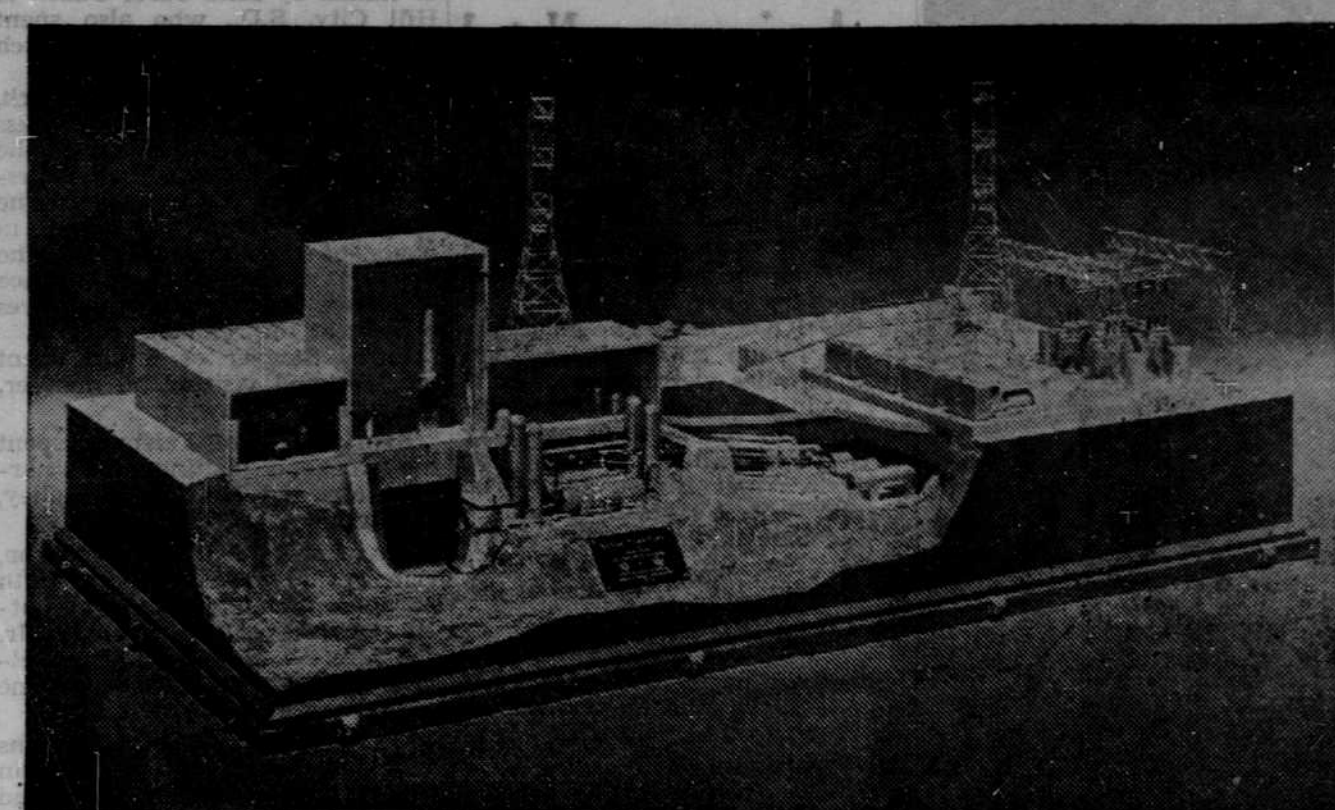
## Dedication Rite for Lord's Acre
