**Farm Safety Is Everyone's Task**

Holt county communities, along with hundreds of others throughout the nation, are observing national farm safety week, July 24-30.

President Eisenhower in a nationwide proclamation stressed the fact that farm safety depends upon each individual.

He also summarized the week's importance and objective: "A death toll of 14,000 farm residents each year is a tragic loss to the nation.

"The 12th observance of national farm safety week will be successful if each farm resident realizes the fact that his safety is in his own hands.

"Most important is for the farmer, himself, to make a safety inventory of his home, his equipment, his actions and his attitudes.

"My greetings to every farmer in the United States, to whom I would say: Your safety is in your hands. Please be careful for the sake of your nation and your loved ones."
