LOT 3-CATTLE

Only two animals can be shown in any class by a club member. Any club member hav-ing more will have to choose the animals to be exhibited. Hay and space will be furnished free for the calves owned by club members that are not to be exhibited. Only the calves orginally eartagged or recorded may be shown.

Any class of market cattle may be divided by weight if show warrants.

Entries may be made in ad-vance or on Wednesday, August 17, with Henry Wood of Ewing. All animals must be in place by 9:00 a.m.; Thursday.
