World - Traveler Festival Speaker
CHAMBERS — Rev. O. H. Schmidt, executive secretary of the board of foreign missions, Lutheran church (Missouri synod), will be the mission festival speaker at St. Paul's Lutheran church at Chambers on Sunday, November 13. Special services are being planned.

These areas, part of the world-wide mission enterprise of the church, will be the subject of a forthcoming book to be published by Concordia Publishing House, St. Louis, Mo.
Doctor Schmidt will have colored slides from these countries.
