Bring or send all copies of the tax statements which you will receive before January 1. Bring or send along the 1955 registration certificates and amount of tax and license fee. Include 25 cents for postage on all passenger car plates, 3 cents for trailer plates and 10 cents for truck plates. Fee for all passenger cars \$8.00. Only one plate will be issued to all trucks. This one plate to be mounted on the rear on all straight trucks and pickups and on the front on truck-tractors.

For all trucks, pickups and panels being issued a commercial license, it is compulsory that an empty weight certificate be presented before a license can be issued. This ceritficate must show the name of owner, kind of truck or semi-trailer, engine or identification numebr, date, and must be signed by some scale attendant, and the weight. Tractor and semi-trailer must be weighed separate. Weight certificate blanks are being mailed out to all commercial truck owners. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated.
