**MARKET REPORT**  
 Tuesday, Mar. 6th  
 Cattle receipts 891 head. Snow flurries Tuesday kept some of the cattle consignments away but buyers filled the pavilion to bid on the cattle offered, including the 40 head of Registered Hereford Bulls on Sale, Eleven Clement Bros. Bulls averaged \$340.00 per head, but the sale top went to Ed Hoffman & Sons on an aged bull at \$520.00.  
 Lightweight stocker cattle continued in best demand with some prices reflecting higher bids than a week ago. Steer calves sold largely from \$19.00 to \$22.00 with only a few head above the latter price. Heifer mates mostly \$16.00 to \$17.75 cwt. Yearling steers weren't plentiful but those offered brought bids of from \$16.25 to \$17.50 cwt. Yearling heifers largely selling in packages, brought from \$15.00 to \$17.00 cwt.  
 Butcher cattle sold 25 to 50 cents per hundred higher with canners and cutters \$8.00 to \$8.75; commercial cows \$9.00 to \$9.75; beef cows \$10.00 to \$11.50; bulls from \$12.00 to \$13.25 cwt.
