

Receipts proved to be larger than anticipated despite the threatening weather. Prices generally were steady with last week's auction with only spots showing weakness in the stockers and feeders. Butcher cattle fully steady and in good demand. There were several out-state buyers on hand and broad demand from local buyers which resulted in one of the most active sales in recent weeks. Steers weighing from 400 to 500 lbs. sold mostly \$19.00 to \$22.00. Comparable weight hetfers fully steady in strong demand at prices from \$16.00 to \$17.85 wt. Light weight yearling steers from 550 lbs. to 650 lbs. mostly \$17.50 to \$20.00. Heavier weight largely from \$13.00 to \$19.00 with some of the plainer small packages of these steers selling above last week's auction.
