Roll call was answered by naming and describing a pasture grass. Fourteen members were present, one absent, and we had one visitor.

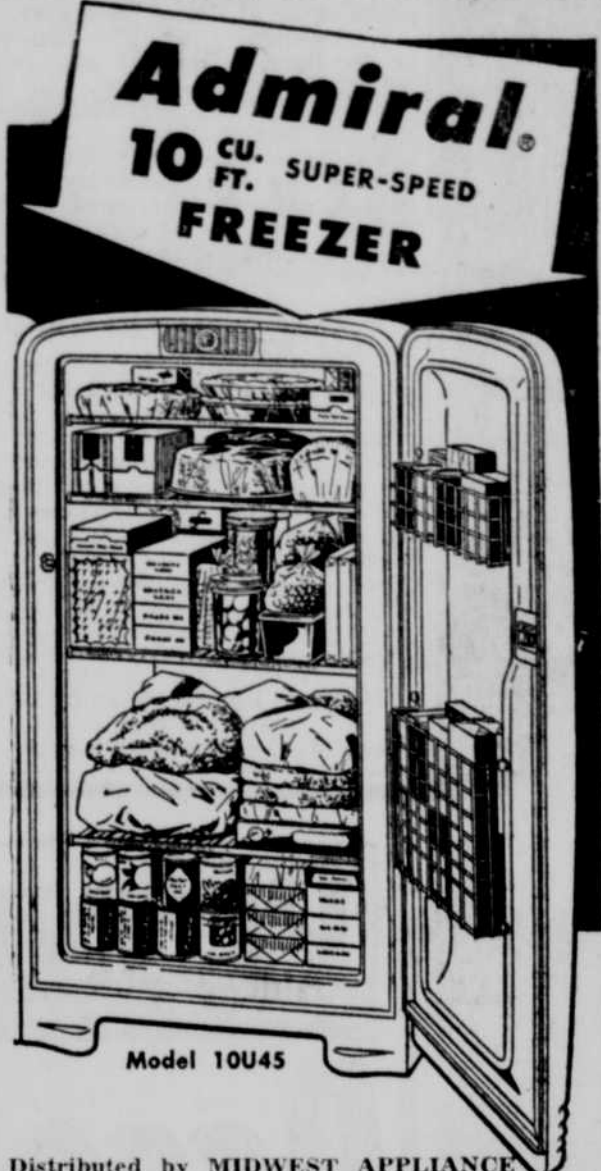
The Crumly girls—Janice and Donna—gave an illustrated talk on the life of the cattle grub worm and how it is controlled.
