**(READ THESE RULES)**

1. Entries for Class J are limited to boys and girls enrolled in 4-H clubs in Holt county.
2. All entries in this class will clear through the County Agent's office. All entries shall be made through the local club leader or fair superintendents.
3. Exhibits must represent the exhibitor's own work accomplished since the last fair.
4. Four-H club members may show in 4-H class without purchasing an exhibitor's ticket but an exhibitor's ticket will be required to exhibit in open class.
5. Only articles mentioned in the premium list will be eligible to receive premiums.
6. No premium money will be paid by the management until the 4-H final reports are received in the County Agent's office.
7. In case of only one entry, prize shall be awarded on quality.
8. All possible diligence and care will be used to prevent loss or injury to exhibits, but the management of the fair will in no way be responsible should loss or injury occur. Each club is responsible for entering and removing exhibits.
9. See general rules for removal of exhibits.

**Entry Rules**

Four-H livestock may be entered any time before and up to 6 p.m., Monday, August 13, 1956. Those wishing to enter by mail please send entries to HENRY WOOD, superintendent of livestock, Ewing, Nebraska.

All livestock to be in place and ready for judging Tuesday, August 14, by 9 a.m.

Agricultural, home economics and all other 4-H exhibit entries to be entered and in place by 6 p.m., Monday, August 13. Judging to take place on Tuesday, August 14.

Judging of individual and team demonstrations, home economics judging contests to take place on Wednesday, August 15.

Livestock judging to be Tuesday, August 14.

**LOT 1**

**Individual and Team Demonstrations**

Wednesday, August 15, 9 a.m. A team demonstration shall consist of two members of the same standard boys' or girls' 4-H club in which the record of each member is up-to-date at fair time. Individual demonstrations may be given by any individual in their own project. Demonstrations should not be less than 10 minutes nor more than 30 minutes in length. Individual demonstrations not less than 5 minutes nor more than 30. Judges' questions only will be scored in competitive demonstrations. Home economics and agricultural demonstrations will start at 9 a.m., on August 15. Premiums are as follows:

**LOT 3**

**Livestock Showman Contest**

Any member showing either dairy or beef animals, swine or sheep, is entitled to enter this contest regardless of placing. Judging will be done on the basis of ability to fit and show the animal. Blue, \$2; Red, \$1.50; White, \$1. Four high individuals.

All members showing will be judged for showmanship while they are showing their livestock. Finals will be run last to determine the winners in each division, 4-H and FFA.

Showmanship contest will be set up in swine and sheep division if show warrants. Blue, \$1.50; Red, \$1; White, 75c. One division only.

**Special Awards**

A special herdsman award will be set up. In addition purple, blue, red and white ribbons will be given the four high individuals.

**Tractor Driving Contest**

For 4-H members. Judged on proper handling of tractor, safety precautions and maintenance. Entries are limited to tractor club members. Contest will be held on Wednesday afternoon.

**Livestock Judging**

All livestock will be judged and placed according to the Danish system, which is blue ribbon, red ribbon and white ribbon groups. In addition, a purple group will be selected from the blue awards in each class if the judge feels the show warrants.

**LOT 4 — CATTLE**

Only two animals can be shown in any class by a club member. Any club member having more will have to choose the animals to be exhibited. Hay and space will be furnished free for the calves owned by club members that are not to be exhibited. Only the calves originally earmarked may be shown.

Any class of market cattle may be divided by weight if show warrants.

Entries may be made in advance or on Monday, August 13, with Henry Wood of Ewing. All animals must be in place and ready to show by 9 a.m., Tuesday.

**Special Awards**

The Holt County Hereford Breeders' Association has arranged to give a plaque to the champion Hereford baby beef, one to the champion Hereford stocker-

feeder and one to the champion Hereford breeding heifer. It will also provide a cup for the grand champion of any of these classes if said grand champion is a Hereford animal.

The Holt County Angus Breeders' Association will award plaques to high placing Angus.

**Breeding Heifers**

Only heifers that have been tattooed may be shown—must be registered or eligible for registry. The following classes are set up, each class to compete by breeds: Blue, red and white groups, \$5, \$4, \$3, and all others shown, \$1.

1. Purebred heifer calf under 6 months old — Blue, Red, White
  2. Purebred heifer calf 6 months to 1 year — Blue, Red, White
  3. Purebred heifer, 1 year, under 2 years — Blue, Red, White
  4. Purebred breeding heifer — Blue, Red, White
- Blue, \$5; Red, \$4; White, \$3; and all others \$1.

**Breeding Classes**

(Cow and Calf)

Only cow and calf projects may compete.

5. Angus cow and calf, under 1 year — Blue, Red, White
6. Shorthorn cow and calf under 1 year — Blue, Red, White

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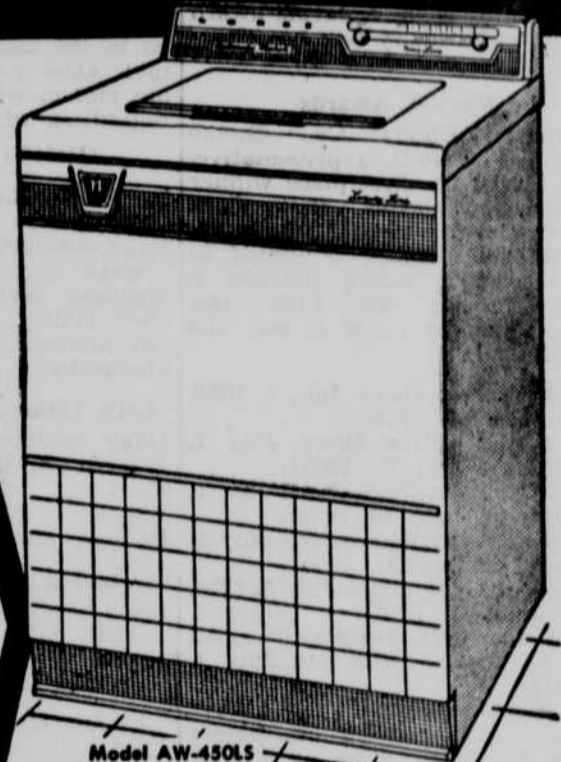
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
