MONDAY, OCTOBER 22
The full limit of 2,500 calves at last Monday's special calf auction met a good reception by buyers at prices generally \$1.00 to \$1.50 higher than a week ago. A very uniform demand was made for an active sale.

Top steer calves at \$23.55 with a big percent selling from \$21.00 to \$25.00. Medium and good kinds cleared more readily at \$19.00 to \$20.50. Top on heifer calves \$18.25 with \$17.25 to \$17.75 paid for the bulk, with only a few at \$16.00 cwt.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 23
A light run of 1,200 head sold fully steady with a week ago. Top on 600 lb. steers at \$19.65. Heavier yearlings \$18.00 to \$18.80. Two year olds at \$17.00 to \$17.50, heifers 25 to 50 cents higher. Cows fully steady at \$8.00 to \$11.00, depending on flesh.
