The attention of bidders is invited to the fact that the Department of Roads and Irrigation has been advised by the Wage and Hour Division, U.S. Department of Labor, that contractors engaged in highway construction work are required to meet the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060), as amended.

The minimum wage paid to all intermediate labor employed on this contract shall be one dollar and thirty cents (\$1.30) per hour. The minimum wage paid to all unskilled labor employed on this contract shall be one dollar (\$1.00) per hour.

Plans and specifications for the work may be seen and information secured at the office of the Division Engineer of the Department of Roads and Irrigation at Ainsworth, Nebraska, or at the office of the Department of Roads and Irrigation at Lincoln, Nebraska.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish bond in an amount equal to 100% of his contract.

As an evidence of good faith in submitting a proposal for this work, the bidder must file with his proposal, a certified check made payable to the Department of Roads and Irrigation and in an amount not less than nine thousand (\$9,000) dollars.
