Overtakes on Hiway
A westbound semitruck driven by Donald Irvin Gotschall, 39, of East Bountiful, Utah, upset at 10:15 p.m., Monday near the junction of U.S. highway 20 and the Ewing road (108), seven miles east of the junction of highways 20-275.
The driver told State Patrolman Robert Gude he encountered bright lights of an oncoming car, got onto the soft shoulder and the outfit overturned.
Gude said Gotschall volunteered for a blood test.
The truck was loaded with 600 bushels of shelled corn. Owner of the outfit is William R. Smith of East Bountiful.
Gude estimated damage at about \$1,000.
Gotschall had been released earlier Monday from the Lutheran hospital at Sioux City. He was hospitalized here following the accident.

The models include the Star Chief series on a 124-inch wheel base, the Super Chief and the Chief on the 122-inch wheel-bases. There will be 16 new body styles, according to Robert J. Krotter.

"From the massive gleaming front to the smart, streamlined fins of the rear fenders, the 1957 Pontiacs are a triumph of modern design and safety engineering. The body design is new. 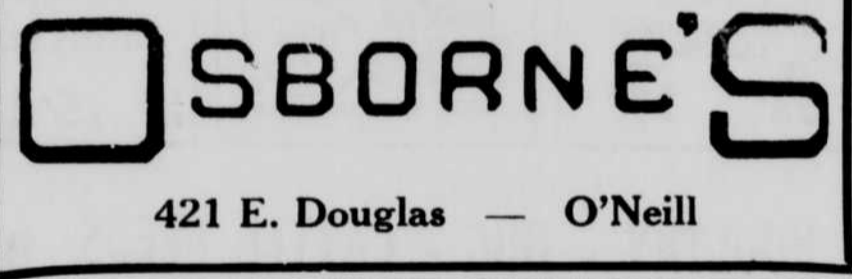
