Sergeant Rouse, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Rouse, is stationed at Columbus, O., with the air force.

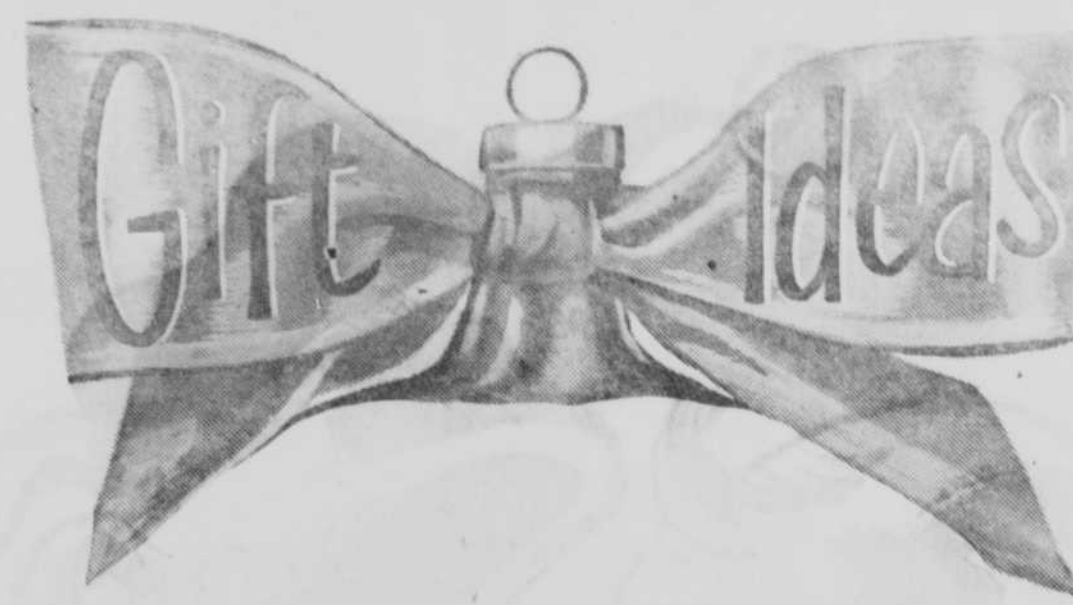
The couple will reside in Columbus until Sergeant Rouse completes his enlistment.

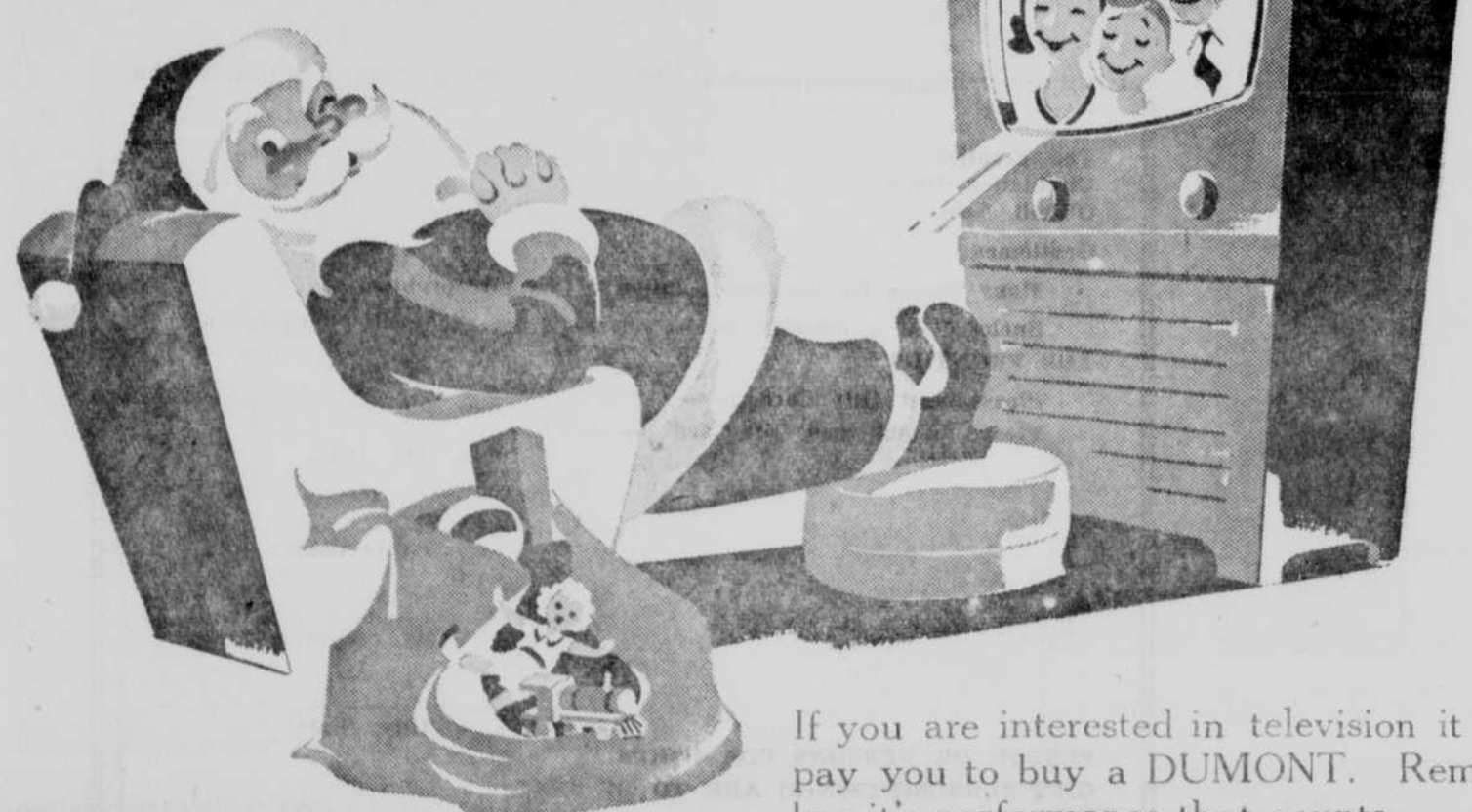
