
Choc-Scotch Pudding

Repeat, alte cookies and pudding until each cup contains three cookies and three layers of pudding. Chill overnight.

Top with whipped cream and serve in the individual custord cups, or unmold into dessert dishes and serve with light cream, maple syrup or whipped cream, as desired. Makes six servings.
