Market Report

Old man winter seemed to take a firm grip all over our area and consequently our run of both cattle and hogs was omewhat curtailed. However, we still sold around 600 hogs on an active market. Top on choice butchers was \$18.50 with about 200 head of the No. 1 hogs selling from \$18.25 to \$18.40. Hogs grading in the No. 2 and No. 3 pracket sold from \$17.75 to \$18.10. Heavier hogs weighing from 270 to 310 sold from \$16.50 to \$17.35. Very few sows in the offering but one consignment of choice lightweight ows sold at \$16.00.

In spite of the cold weather, we had about 100 head of cattle. We could have sold onsiderably more had we had hem. With nothing strictly fancy in the offering, no records wese made but prices seemed to be well in line with the current market.


