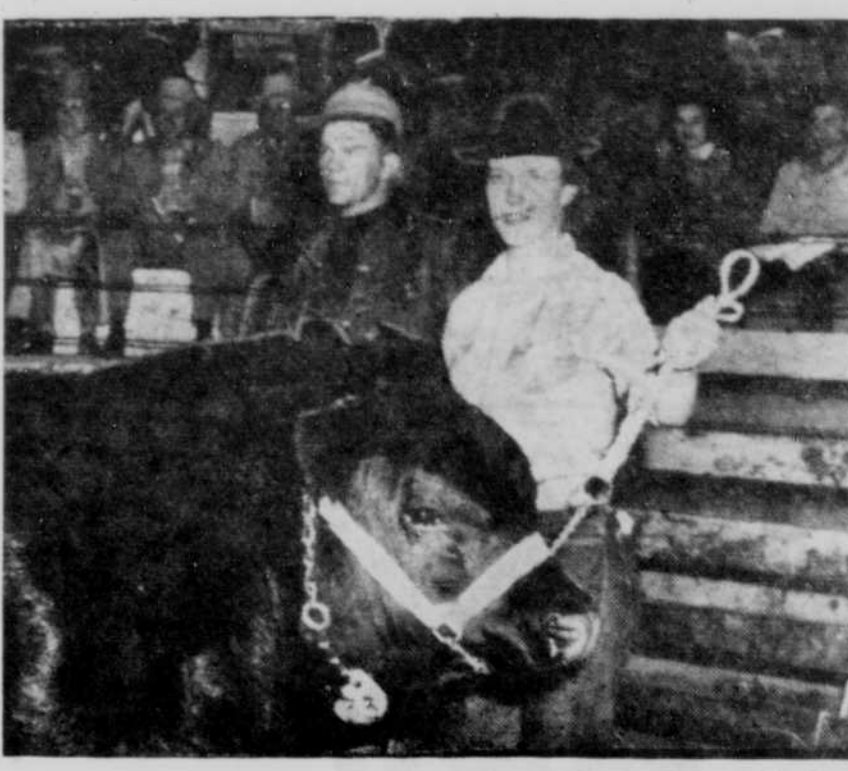


OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS Holt County Board of Supervisors
