WHEREAS title to said property was acquired by said County of Holt at a cost of less than Five Hundred Dollars, and
WHEREAS said County of Holt has the opportunity to sell said property to Sterling LeRoy Albright for the sum of \$500, and it appearing that said price is the fair value of said property under the present conditions and is the full amount that the County of Holt has invested therein, or is the best price that can be obtained, and that said property should be sold and returned to the tax rolls.
NOW, THEREFORE, I move you that the County of Holt sell to Sterling LeRoy Albright the real estate above described for the sum of \$500, and that the Chair-

man of the Board and Clerk be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver to said purchaser a good and sufficient deed to said property upon payment of the purchase price aforesaid.
