Assembly Tall Boys Grab Church Title

The Assembly of God entry in the church basketball league squeaked out a win over the Methodists in Saturday night's title game, 45-43.

Chace Finishes 3d in 60-Yd. Dash

Sprinter Larry Chace of O'Neill figured prominently in the Big Seven conference indoor track meet Saturday at Kansas City, Mo. He is a veteran on the Colorado university Buffalo squad.

Chace placed third in the 60-yard dash at Kansas City, just behind Henry Wiebe of Missouri (.062) and Keith Gardner of Nebraska.

Chace, a junior, has won points for Colorado in two previous conference meets. He was fourth in the 60-yard dash at the indoor championships a year ago. In the outdoor meet he was fifth in the 100 and fourth in the 220.

Losses Opening Try
Larry has won two of three starts thus far this year. He lost his opening try in the 60 to Nebraska's Jamaican ace, Keith Gardner, who had to break a meet record with a .062 to beat Chace. The Buff flash then won the 60 in the Colorado varsity-freshman meet with the same time.

In Chace's last outing, on Saturday, February 23, he defeated sprinters from Oklahoma and Iowa State in a triangular meet at Boulder. His time was .064 on a slow track.

The champs were aided and abetted by a large cheering section; the Methodists were lacking moral supporters and were undersized compared to the towering Assembly crew.

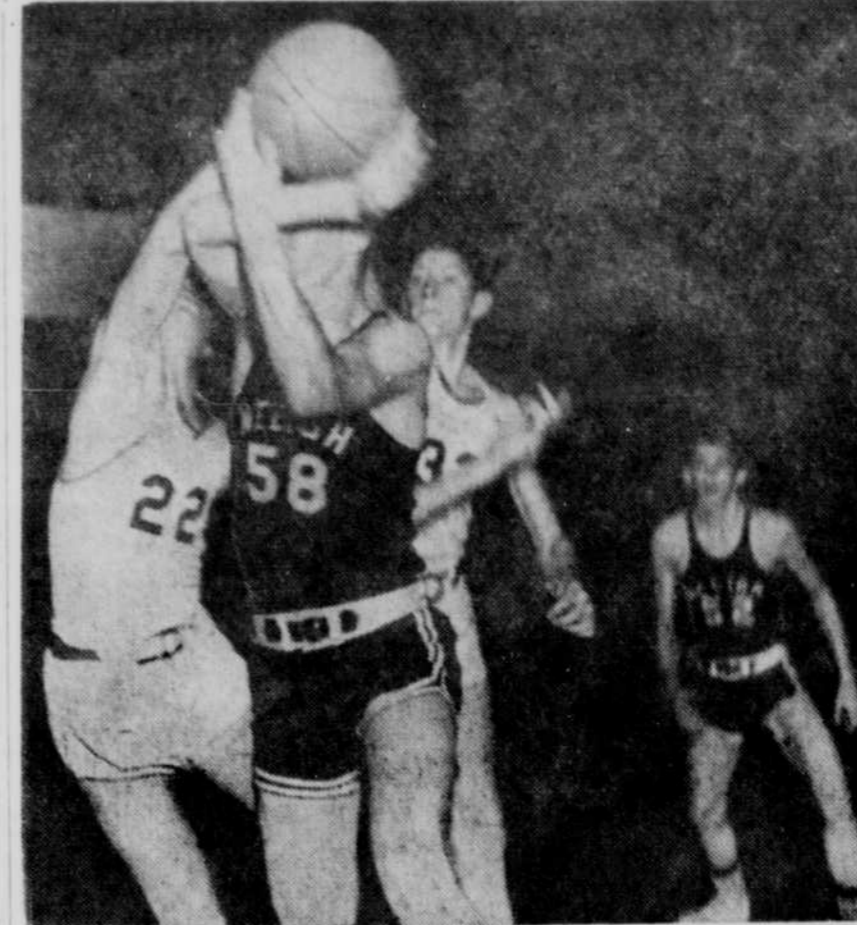
