RESOLUTION WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of the County Board of Supervisors of Holt County, Nebraska, on the 28th day of February, 1957, motion was made by Landreth, seconded by Frickel, that the following Resolution be adopted:

To Grant permission to the farmer to construct an erosion control dam on the road right

of way between Sections 1 and 12 and between Sections 2 and 11, in Township 30, North Range 9, Holt County, Nebraska. The County Board of Supervisors of Holt County, Nebraska, agree to relieve the farmer and the government of all liabilities that may result from the installation of the structure and they agree to maintain the structure, if and when it becomes a COUNTY ROAD.
