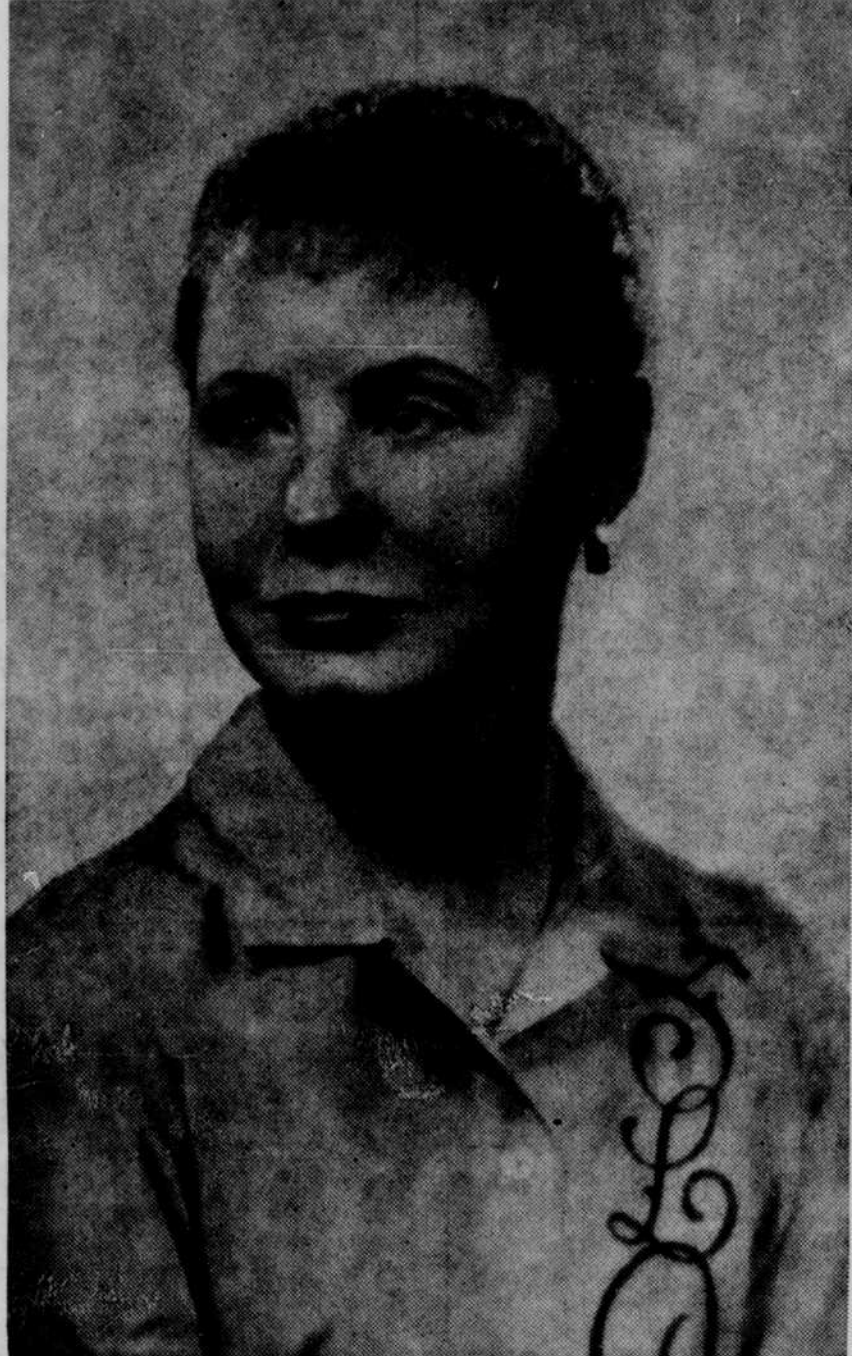

Members of Holt county school boards idle while ballots are being counted for the new redistricting committee.—The Frontier Photo.

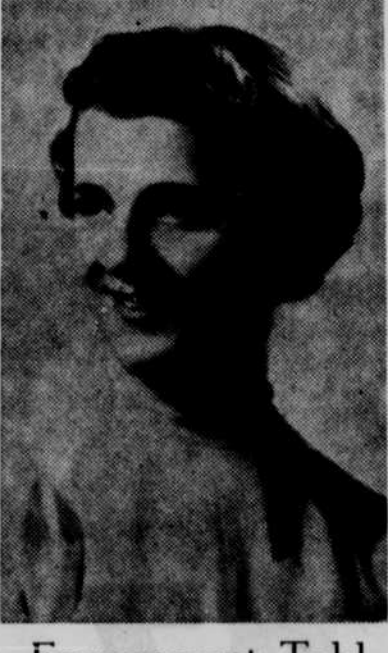


Engagement Is Told
