ORDINANCE NO. 301-A

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO VACATING A CERTAIN STREET IN O'NEILL, NEBRASKA; PROVIDING FOR MAKING A RECORD OF SUCH VACATION IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR A RECORD OF SUCH VACATION IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK OF THE COUNTY OF HOLT AND STATE OF NEBRASKA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, HOLT COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

1. That the following street of the City of O'Neill, Holt County, Nebraska, be vacated to-wit: That part of Sixth Street in McDonald home.

2. That a record of the vacation of the above said street be entered in the records of the City of O'Neill, Holt County, Nebraska.

3. That a certified copy of this ordinance shall be furnished by the City Clerk of O'Neill, Holt County, Nebraska, to the County Clerk of the County of Nebraska and the State of Nebraska and the same shall be recorded in said County Clerk's office.

4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force for and after its passage, approval and publication.
