There was a Lenten prayer vigil held at the Methodist church Wednesday, March 19 from 6 to 12 p.m.

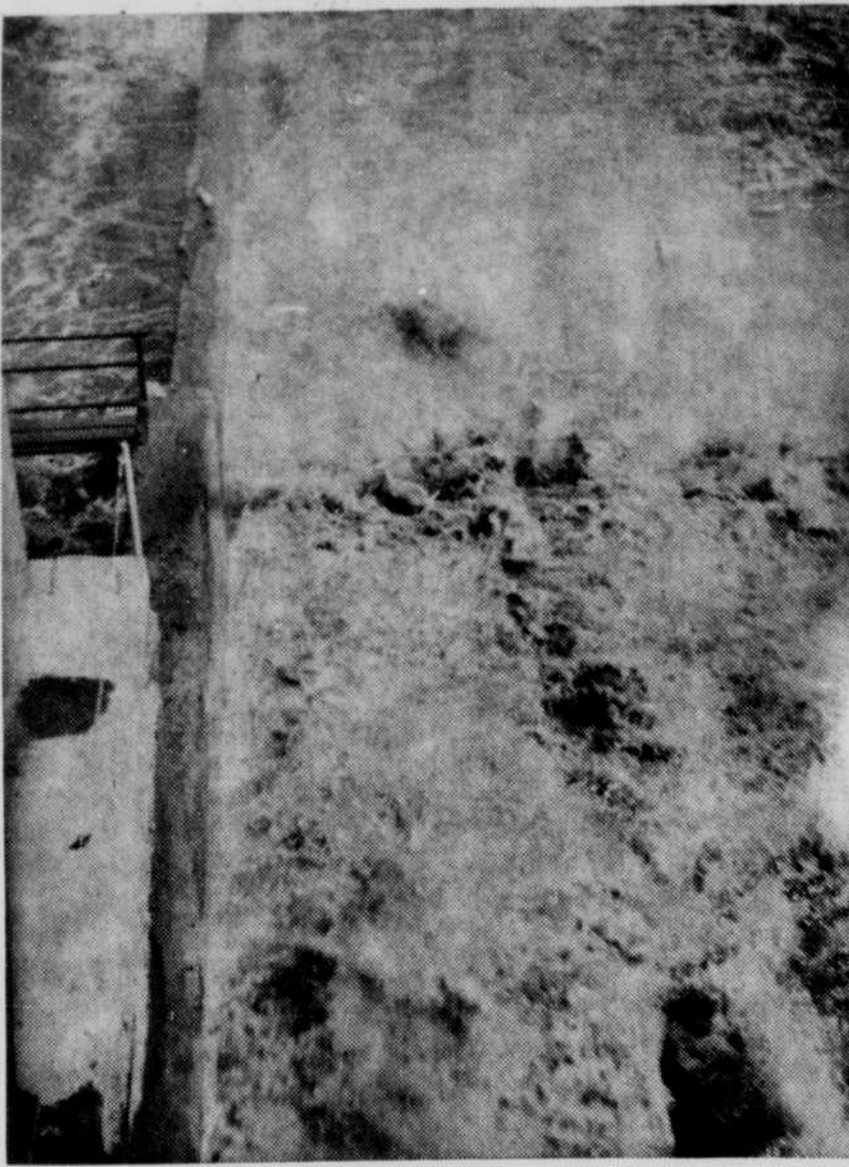
