There'll be 200 feeder pigs of various sizes.

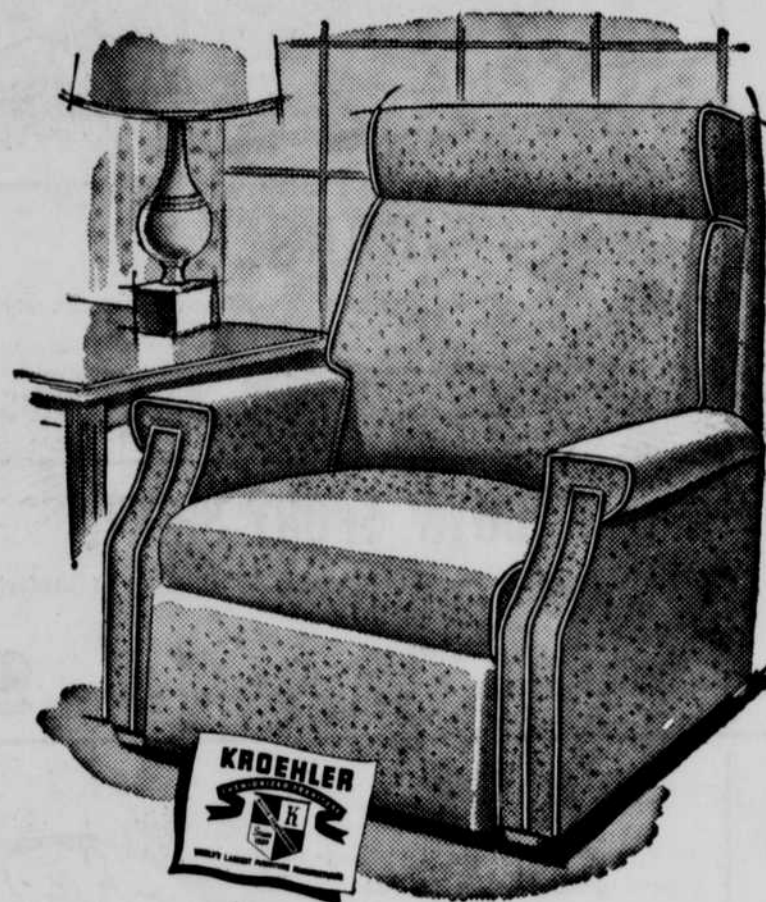
