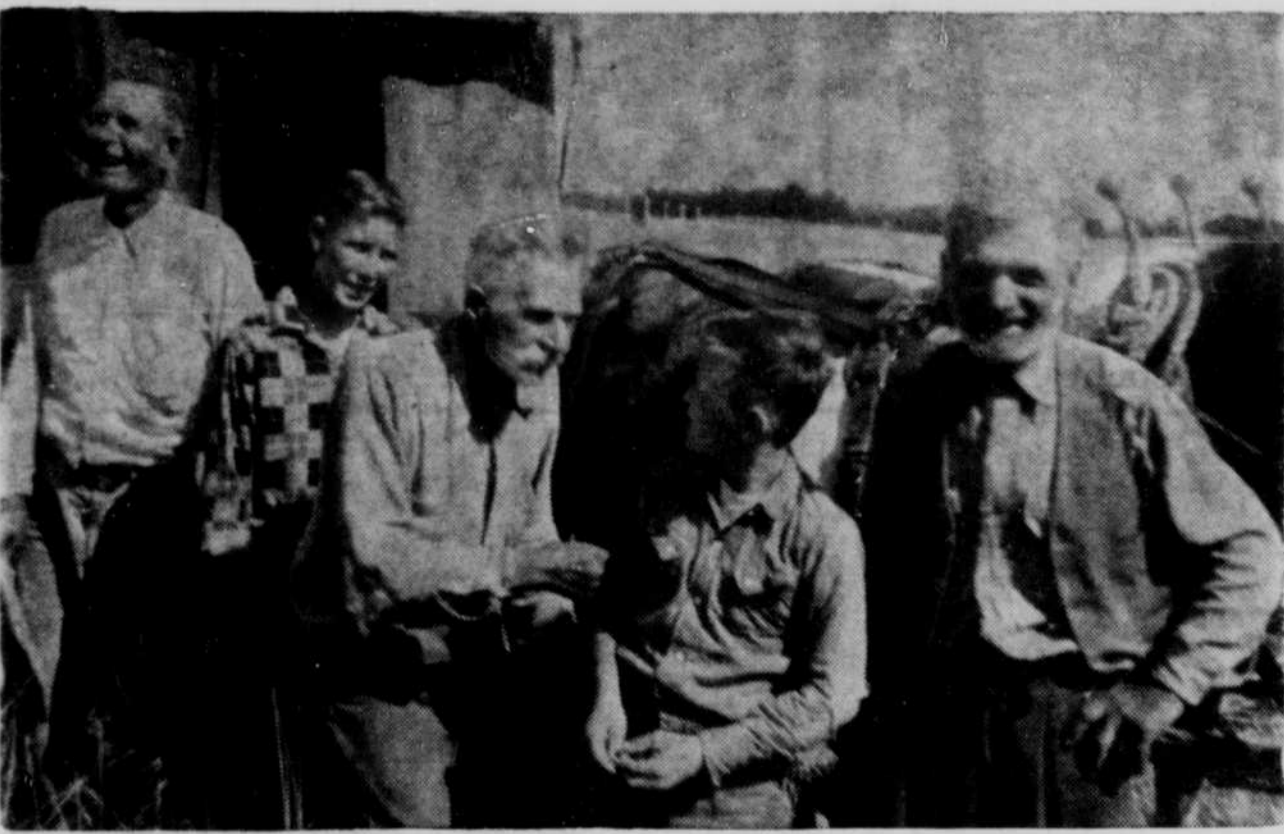
Mrs. Pat McLain of Ewing, the former Janet Bartak, received the prize for being the youngest mother.
