Probationary Driver's License Renewals

All Probationary Driver's Licenses, which includes anyone under 20 years of age at the time license was issued, issued between September 1, 1957, and August 30, 1958, will expire on September 1, 1958, and must be renewed between the dates of September 1, 1958, and October 31, 1958.

Operators permitting their license to lapse will be required to appear before the examiners and successfully pass the required test before acquiring a new operator's license.

his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Campbell. She planned to leave today (Thursday) for her home in Denver.

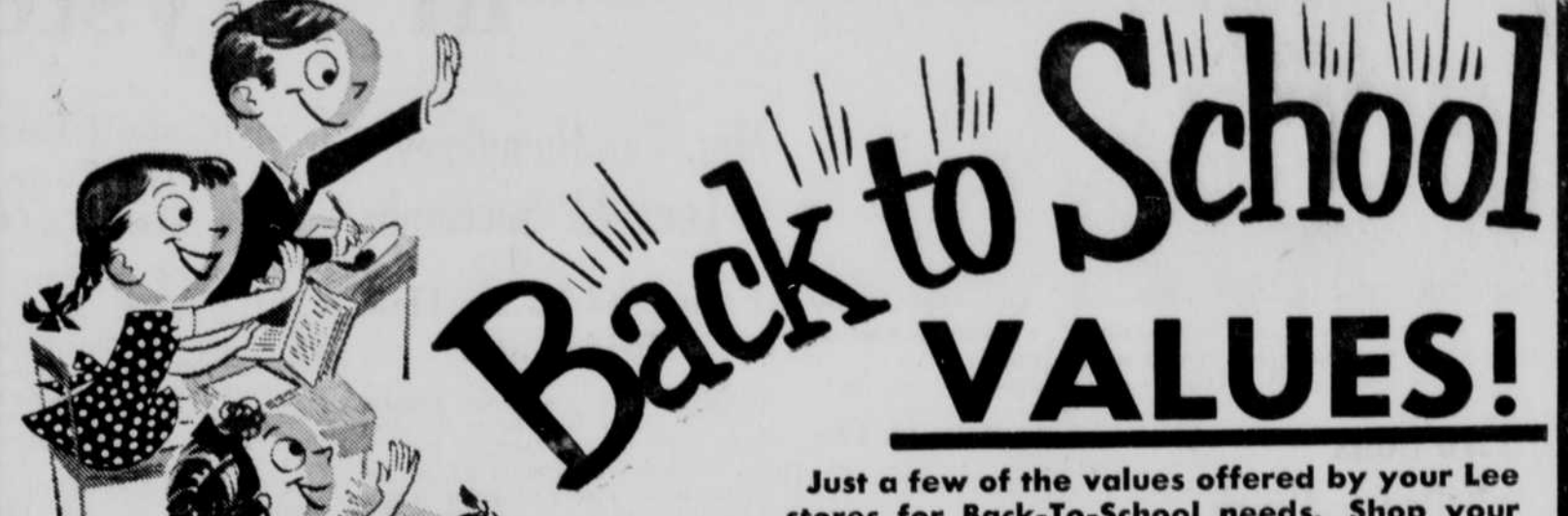

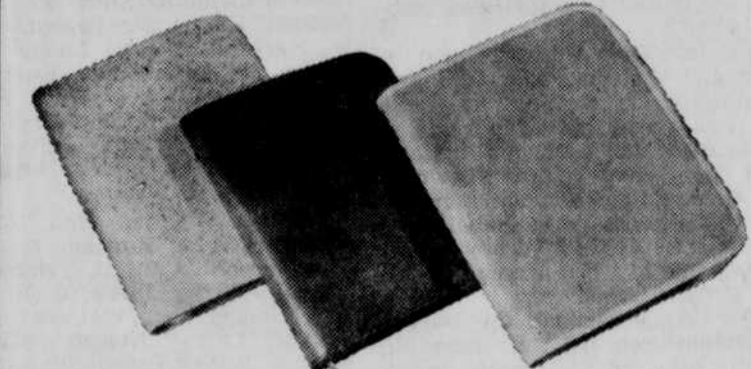

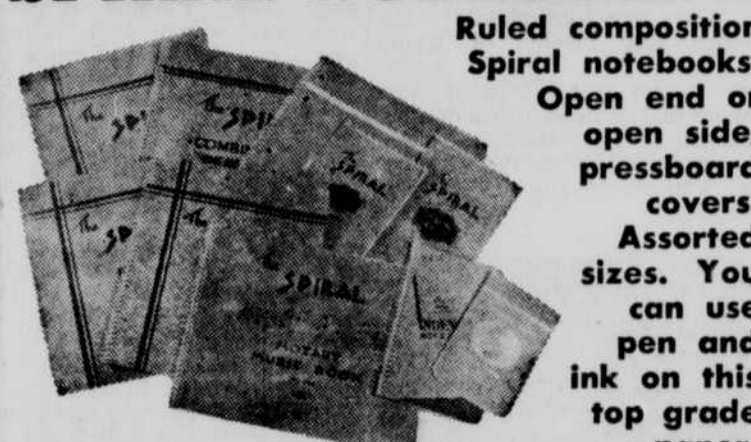
